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

#### CEO'S Report

HOUSING NEEDS A CENTRAL FOCUS IN NY

If you have been paying attention to the news lately, you might notice that housing is a major focus of today's policy debate. Most of us have known for a long time that

we have a housing crisis on Long Island. Too often, we hear more and more of our friends and family moving away because of Long Island lacks both a diversity of housing choices and a supply of affordable housing. I'm sure everyone knows someone whose kids wanted to stay here, but couldn't find a place or who has a friend or relative who bolted for Florida, the Carolina's or another southern or western state which are more affordable.

Stories like this is why Governor Kathy Hochul has made housing a centerpiece of her 2023 legislative agenda. According to the US Census, over the past two years, New York State has led the nation in outmigration, losing more than 400,000 people during that time period. To help reverse this pattern, Governor Hochul has laid out an ambitious plan that calls for building 800,000 new housing units across the state over the next decade.

To achieve this goal, on Long Island, each municipality would be required to grow their number of new units by 3% over a three-year period. Additionally, the area ½ mile around each LIRR station would be rezoned to increase density.

Further details of the Governor's plan include:

• A locality would get 1 point for new units, 1.5 points for revitalizing an abandoned unit and 2 points for affordable or supportive units.

• If the locality failed to hit their 3% goal or make a good faith effort to hit that goal, then a Fast Track process would come into play. A good faith effort would consist of doing two of the following five preferred actions: permitting accessory dwelling units, facilitating lot splits, removing certain restrictive zoning, allowing certain density levels over a portion of previously developed areas, and rezoning a specified amount of commercial areas to also allow for housing. Localities' enactments of preferred actions would not be subject to state or local environmental

review.

• If a locality met its three-year goal or fulfilled the good faith effort, they would not be subject to the Fast Track approval.

• A developer could utilize the Fast Track process, if the locality failed to meet its goals of take preferred actions.

• This bill requires downstate cities, towns, and villages to amend their zoning and other land use tools to increase the average housing density within half a mile of any non- seasonal LIRR rail station.

• This density requirements in these zones would be:

o Within 15 miles of NYC: 50 units/acre

o 15-30 miles from NYC: 30 units/acre

o 30-50 miles from NYC: 20 units/acre

o 50+ miles from NYC: 15 units/acre

Rezoning will be exempt from state and local
environmental review processes

• The state would establish a \$250 million fund that can be utilized to assist communities with infrastructure improvements to support housing. An additional \$20 million fund would be created to help with planning and development.

The ability to maintain, control and have a say in what happens in our own communities is a very important aspect of local government on Long Island. Thus far, the thought of having Albany dictate how local communities control their own zoning has met sharp resistance from local officials who have organized several press conferences to oppose the Governor's plan.

The state budget is due on April 1st and we can expect the debate to continue until the final moments. LIBI has met with representatives from both the Governor's office and with many of our local officials to hear the ideas from all sides. There is no denying the need for increased housing, but how we get there and the details of the plan are critically important to get right.

LIBI will be proposing recommendations we feel could help streamline the creation of new housing units and we will be actively involved in helping to shape a policy that is best for our industry and for our local communities here on Long Island.

#### Update from NAHB

Having recently returned from the Winter Committee and Leadership Meetings and the International Builder Show (IBS), I thought it appropriate to provide an update on national happenings and the show.

This year's IBS was the most successful in the last 10 years. There were over 70,000 attendees to this year's Las Vegas venue. The committee meetings were held in the 3 days prior to the show. A new slate of Senior Officers were installed with Alicia Huey, a builder and developer from Alabama becoming the Chairperson. Incoming to the Senior Officer ladder is Bill Owens, a custom builder and remodeler from Ohio. Bill has been active over the years of his membership and will bring some new perspectives to the leadership team. Alicia's priorities for this year are to continue to promote housing affordability by addressing supply chain issues, working to eliminate regulatory barriers that increase the cost of housing. She states that, "Increasing the production of attainable and affordable housing is the best solution to the current inflation".

The Inflation Reduction Act was the topic of several committee meetings and there were reports from the

# EPA and DoE. While some of the details are being finalized with an anticipated spring roll-out what is apparent is the there are some significant incentives for builders and remodelers building to Energy Star and the DoE's Net Zero Ready Program. As of now single-family builders building to Energy Star will receive a \$2500.00 tax credit per home, and if a home is certified to the Net Zero Ready Program there is a \$5000 tax credit per home. As of now those credits go to the builder; it is not yet known if there will be a different method how the credit will work for custom builders where the client owns the land. For multi-family builders the credits are \$1000/unit for Energy Star and up to \$5000/unit for Net Zero Ready units utilizing prevailing wage.

The 2024 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC 2024) is approaching the public comment phase and final voting on the proposals is currently taking place. The NAHB has a dedicated group of builders, raters, and staff holding weekly conference calls to finalize the NAHB's positions on the multitude of proposed changes. The focus of this group has been on recognizing the needs, and "headwinds", while keeping the proposed practice practical and affordable.

The National Green Building Standard (NGBS) is currently being reviewed per ANSI protocol. The first draft of the 2024 version should be issued in late spring. New York State is currently in the top 10 for states with Multi-family certification (#9).

#### LIBIS EAST END CHAPTER UPDATE

The East End LIBI effort is off to a good start. We have assembled and continue to develop a group of interested parties who are discussing what an East End effort would look like moving forward.

Our first meeting was in Southampton at the office of Buddy Wines (RLW4). Buddy is a LIBI Member who sees the need for the revival of the East End Chapter and is interested in providing a voice of the East End Contractor as well as a networking agent to pull likeminded people together. In attendance were; Vincent Calvosa, Lois Fricke, Tulio Bertoli, Anthony Confredo, Buddy Wines, Chip Pierson (Squires & Pierson), Brandon Arnister (Arnister Electric), and Bryan Kappenberg. Key items identified were the absolute fact that meetings need to be held East of the Canal, and that issues unique to the five (5) East End Towns should be the focus.

Potentially a good place to start, where East & West share pain, Electronic Permitting and Third Party Inspections.

Both Mike Florio and Tulio Bertoli have initiated contact with people involved in either software or municipal roles that have demonstrated success. This just might be the right jumping off point for LIBI, bringing experience and the power of relationships into play.

Additional meetings and conversations have been taking place with past East End Chapter leaders, namely; Pat Trunzo Jr., Steven Trunzo, and John Barrows. All feel that the need still exists for an East End effort and are willing to participate.

Our next meeting is Tue. Feb. 28 with Building Material Suppliers (RBS/SRS/WMBS) and four (4) Southfork Builders. The mission will be to pull together a contact list and strategize on delivering personal invitations to East End prospects. From there we are proposing a cocktail event in March serving the dual purpose of networking and listening to the needs of a wider group.


Women in LIBI Committee as their chairwoman along with Debbie Davey as the co-chair.
