CEO'S Report

It has been an exciting year for us, with notable legislative victories at the state and local levels, and a steady rate of growth in communities across Long Island. By working together

as a unified front, we will continue to make significant strides in achieving our goals and objectives for the Long Island home building industry. On April 25th, 45 LIBI members joined us for our annual lobby day to Albany to meet with our elected representatives and advocate for issues of importance to the building industry. We had a productive day of meetings and conversations and helped to advance many of our objectives, even on issues that were not actively being considered.

As the largest residential building trade association in New York State, LIBI possesses the unique opportunity to truly change the trajectory of Long Island's business climate and political decision-making for the better. These beneficial changes cannot happen without the significant support of our members. Our members are the foundation of this organization and the driving force behind our achievements. I applaud their active involvement in event attendance, community service, sponsorship, and supporting our ever-growing political action committee. The synergy of our collective efforts is proving to be advantageous to our aims, and we are pushing forward to bigger and better things every single day.

On Tuesday, May 2nd, the \$229 billion NYS budget was approved, and contained both good and bad outcomes for the Long Island home building industry. Despite much debate and discussion, the Governor's housing proposal was stripped from the budget in the final negotiations. While in Albany, we stressed that any future discussions on housing needs to involve both the builders and the municipalities in order to find solutions that all parties can agree in to address our housing crisis. Another "victory" for LIBI was keeping good cause eviction out of the budget bill, although we will need to be prepared to continue this fight throughout the rest of this session and possibly next year as well.

A \$455 million loan to improve the condition of Belmont Park will add jobs and economic activity to the region. Likewise, the budget authorizes the creation of a sewer and wastewater management district for Suffolk County, which will allow them to fund additional sewer projects, which can open up future development opportunity.

Additionally, the NYS budget, exempted Long Island from the MTA payroll tax hike, which would have further hurt businesses by increasing taxes.

However, the budget sets into motion a ban on gas stoves and furnaces in new buildings, starting in 2026. We continue to have questions on how this legislation will be implemented and want to ensure that the grid is capable and resilient enough to handle the additional capacity and that projects starting now are grandfathered in.

On the local level, the Nassau County Legislature recently passed bill 239-f, which greatly speeds up the process of approving building permits. This reformation of the 239-f process removes the time-consuming, costly and complicated red tape that stifles development. LIBI has fought for reforming this process for some time and we thank County Executive Blakeman and the Nassau Legislature for finally getting this done.

The new law allows for self-certification, by a qualified engineering professional or architect, of construction plans after 10 business days. This is an excellent win for the Long Island building industry, and demonstrates that LIBI's members, their employees, and their families are a robust and persuasive force for Long Island builders and their interests.

Again, my thanks to all of you for your outstanding contributions, tireless efforts, and unwavering commitment to our shared vision. Your passion, skills, and expertise have been invaluable in driving our success, and I have no doubt that we will continue to achieve great things together. As we look ahead, our industry will continue to face additional hurdles and challenges, but I know that great victories are just beyond the horizon.




Congratulations Paolo!

We are pleased to announce that LIBI Builder Paolo Pironi has been appointed to the Nassau County Open Space & Parks Advisory Committee (OSPAC)

The powers and duties of OSPAC in connection with providing advice to the Nassau County Planning Commission shall include the following:

- developing any appropriate criteria, to assist in identifying and prioritizing open space, parks, and areas of recreational, cultural, archeological, habitat or historic significance or of an otherwise environmentally sensitive nature for the purpose of considering their acquisition, preservation, protection, restoration or enhancement.
- dentifying financing mechanisms, including mechanisms involving assistance from other levels of government, to fund the acquisition, preservation, protection, restoration or enhancement of open space, parks, and areas of recreational, cultural archeological, habitat or historic significance or of an otherwise environmentally sensitive nature that have been identified and prioritized utilizing the criteria listed in this title or authorized by it to be developed.
- identifying other mechanisms, including the transfer or purchase of development rights, the establishment of conservation easements, or the establishment of public/private partnerships with the goal of acquiring, preserving, protecting, restoring or enhancing open space, parks, and areas of recreational, cultural or historic significance or of an environmentally sensitive nature. reviewing all leases of county land to non-governmental entities and all long-term use and occupancy permits of county land and to make recommendations to the Nassau County Planning Commission with respect thereto regarding the acquisition, reservation, protection, restoration or enhancement of open space, parks, and areas of recreational, cultural, archeological, habitat, or historic significance or of an otherwise environmentally sensitive nature.

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




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
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Long Island Home Builders Care collected truckloads of clothing, shoes, and handbags for the INN in Hempstead (Interfaith Nutrition Network).
